Harrisburg Flag Contest

For the first time in the Town's history, Harrisburg will soon have a flag to serve as a unique icon that represents its people and culture.

The winning flag design will be sent to a flag shop for production and will be displayed at Town Hall.

Fourteen-year-old Jonathan Andrus proposed the idea of holding a contest to create a Town flag during the public comment section of the March 12, 2018 Town Council meeting and Town Manager Haynes Brigman announced details of the contest at the Town Council meeting on April 9. Between April 9 and June 1, the Town received 50 submissions. Andrus, Town staff and Council narrowed the entries down to the top five. The top five designs will be available for residents to view and vote on to determine the winning Town of Harrisburg flag.

Boone is the Town's Maintenance Technician for Buildings and Grounds, and he has been with the Town since 2008.

Leadership Cabarrus

Town Manager Haynes Brigman graduated from Leadership Cabarrus on May 31, 2018. Leadership Cabarrus, sponsored by Cabarrus Regional Chamber of Commerce, expands awareness of assets and challenges in the Cabarrus County region, and was founded to deepen the knowledge base of dedicated business, industry and community leaders.



The 2018 class of Leadership Cabarrus used its collective expertise and influence to begin the Check Your Rx campaign. Cabarrus County Prescription Drug Drop Off Week was May 14-19, 2018 and residents were asked to safely dispose of any unused opioid prescriptions. Leadership Cabarrus donated two new medication drop boxes, including a drop box at Harrisburg's Hometown Pharmacy.

Development in the Town of Harrisburg is guided by the Harrisburg Area Land Use Plan, created in partnership with the Cabarrus County Planning and Development Department. The Town and County updated the 2010 Harrisburg Area Land Use Plan and it was approved by Town Council after a public hearing on June 11, 2018.
