

## Yard Waste Collection

The Public Works Department collects yard waste on a weekly basis.

### YARD WASTE COLLECTION GUIDELINES

\*Must be loose (not bagged) and placed behind the curb of the residence that generated the yard waste (not in the road, but as close as practical, within 4-6 feet).

\*Please be mindful that it can take several days to cover the entire town, therefore your yard waste can only be collected once a week.

\*Leaves and grass cannot be mixed with sticks, rocks, dirt, brush, paper, etc. If other items are mixed with the leaves and grass, the entire load cannot be picked up.

\*Brush consists of shrubs, flowers, and plants.

\*Limbs cannot exceed 6 ft. in length and must be stacked loosely with cut ends toward the street.

\*The pile must also be at least 8 feet from any sign, water meter, mailbox, or other stationary object, and away from any low overhead lines.

\*If you have less than a truckload there is no charge for collection. If you have enough for a truckload (16ft long, 6ft wide and 4ft high) there will be \$100 fee. Please make arrangements with Town Hall for payment.

Waste generated by private landscaping contractors will not be collected unless arranged by the homeowner for a fee. No debris created by commercial operations will be collected.

## Bulk Item Collection Guidelines:

ALL REQUESTS FOR BULK ITEM COLLECTION MUST BE SUBMITTED TO CUSTOMER SERVICE AT 704-455-5614 BEFORE 5PM THE TUESDAY PRIOR TO THE WEDNESDAY COLLECTION.

Bulk items that will be collected by scheduled pickup are:

- Small amounts of carpet and padding.
- Small amounts of shingle or construction materials.
- White goods (washers, dryers, refrigerators, dishwashers, etc.)
- Furniture (beds, sofas, lawn chairs, tables, lighting fixtures, etc.)
- Large boxes (cardboard/pasteboard, broken down and stacked).
- Metal items (lawn care equipment, playground equipment, etc.). All fluids must be drained. Large items such as playground equipment must be disassembled. Lawn mowers will be drained of all gas & oil and have tires removed.
- Doors, windows & decking.

The following bulk items WILL NOT be picked up:


- Household garbage
- Tires, batteries, oil, paint, or liquid toxic materials
- Dead animals
- Demolition debris, dirt, rock or brick, sod, pavement or concrete
- Electronics, such as computer monitors and TVs (as of July 1, 2011 per new legislation)

All bulk items shall be placed 8 ft. from mail boxes & signs, landscape, or other stationary objects and overhead lines.

**The Town reserves the right not to handle any material that it deems unsafe for its employees!**

All bulk items pickups are collected on Wednesday of each week, or as soon as possible thereafter depending on current workloads.

***Bulk Item Collection is limited to once per week.***

## PAYMENT TERMS:

All bills are due and payable upon receipt. It is the customer's responsibility to pay their bill by the 15<sup>th</sup> of the month. If payment is not received by the 15<sup>th</sup>, a \$10 late fee will be added. If the account is not paid in full by the 25<sup>th</sup> of the month, service will be disconnected without further notice and a fee of \$25 will be charged before service is reconnected. If payment is received after 4:00pm, the reconnect fee is \$50.

Reconnection will be received in a reasonable amount of time, not to exceed 24 hours.

# Trash Collection



Only household garbage will be collected. Please curb your container properly because the collection is fully automated. Place your roll out within 5 ft. of the road. Do not place the roll out next to your mailbox. Make sure it is clear of trees and overhanging limbs. Curb your roll out container the night before because collection begins at 6 a.m. Make sure the wheels of your roll out are away from the road. (The lid hinge should be placed away from the road.) Place everything in the roll out container. Do not place anything on top of roll out. Do not use your own cans. If you consistently have more than one roll out full, you need to request an additional container. This must be done at your cost; the Town provides one container per household.

### Items Not For The Landfill

**Waste Oil:** Most service stations have waste oil tanks and will usually accept waste oil at no charge. Waste oil is used in making asphalt and can also be purified for re-use.

**\*Paint:** Remove lids to allow paint to harden. When paint has hardened, it may be placed in a roll out container.

**\*Batteries:** When your new battery is purchased the seller will take the old one. Most auto parts stores will take an old battery even when you do not buy a new battery.

**\*Tires:** When new tires are purchased, the seller will take old tires. Most tire dealers will take tires if you did not purchase any for free or a small fee.

**\*Electronics:** E-waste may contain toxic chemicals and has been banned from North Carolina landfills. Electronics can be taken to recycling centers.

Local facilities that will take these items for free are: Cabarrus County Household Hazardous Waste (704-920-3278) or Cabarrus County Construction and Demolition Landfill (704-920-2950)

If a holiday falls during the week, your trash/recycle collection may be a day late.



# Harrisburg Recycles



**RECYCLE PICKUP IS EVERY OTHER WEEK!**

**This goes IN the recycle bin.**

**This stays OUT of the recycle bin.**

- **NEWSPAPERS:** Including inserts, coupons, and advertisements



- **MIXED PAPER:** Examples are office paper, file folders, magazines, junk mail, hard bound books, computer/fax paper, telephone books, magazines, brochures, all colored paper, spiral note books, hanging file folders, candy wrappers, and envelopes.



- **CARDBOARD:** Break down or cut up cardboard so it fits inside the bin, examples include cereal/tooth paste, shoe boxes, cardboard egg containers, and gift boxes.



- **GLASS CONTAINERS:** All glass containers. Examples are food and beverage jars. Rinse with warm water then toss. Easy!

- **ALUMINUM:** Soda cans and clean foil.



- **MILK & JUICE CONTAINERS:** Example include school milk cartons, juice boxes, and plastic milk containers.



- **RIGID PLASTICS:** Including shrink wrap, plastic flower pots, take home dinner plastic trays, children's plastic pool, shower curtains, ketchup, shampoo/bleach bottles, yogurt cups/lids, CD cases, macaroni/potato salad containers, empty vitamin/prescription bottles, plastic film/transparencies, and plastic tarps. All items must be cut down to fit inside the bin.



- **STEEL & TIN CANS:** Including small scrap metals household items only and bi-metal cans.

- **NO CONTAMINATED PAPER:** Examples are pizza boxes, (Greasy cheese contaminates the container), used paper plates, birthday cake boxes, wax paper, or foil/mylar gift wrap.



**NO PAPER SOILED BY PETS OR BATHROOM WASTE!**

- **NO STYROFOAM:** All kinds regardless if there is a triangle or a number underneath the carton, packing Styrofoam peanuts, or Styrofoam egg cartons.

- **NO CLOTHING OR OTHER TEXTILES!**

- **NO CERAMICS OR COMMERCIAL GLASS:** Including coffee mugs, windshields, or mirrors.

- **NO HAZARDOUS, MEDICAL, UNIVERSAL, OR ELECTRONIC WASTE:** Including lancets, syringes with needles, aerosol cans, light bulbs, batteries, paint cans, thermostats, fluorescent light tubes, cell phones, computers, TV's, or car batteries. (These items need to be taken to the Household Hazardous Waste Facility at 246 General Services Drive, Concord, NC - or by phone at 704-920-3278)



- **NO CONSTRUCTION OR DEMOLITION MATERIAL!**

- **NO WAXED OR COATED CARD BOARD BOXES.** Examples include boxes used to ship fruit or vegetables.

- **NO DIAPERS!**



- **NO CARPET!**

- **NO DISPOSABLE DRINKING STRAWS OR PLASTIC FORK/KNIFE/SPOONS.**





# Bulk Item Pick Ups

Town of Harrisburg residents should call (704) 455-5614 to schedule items for pick up.



## Residents who are inside town limits receive **FREE** curbside, bulk item pickup service every Wednesday.

### YES! We can pick these up:

- Mattress/Box spring
- Furniture (Including but not limited to sofa, tables, chairs, bed frame, mirror, lamps)
- Wood pcs (Flooring, decking, broken apart furniture, fencing, etc.)
- Appliances (Including refrigerators, microwaves, ovens, washer, dryer, vacuum, toasters, water heaters, dishwasher, etc.) **\*\*Doors must be removed from refrigerators and freezers\*\***
- Lawnmowers & other garden tools (Oil and gas must be drained)
- Large cardboard (Must be broken down)
- Metal pieces
- Exercise equipment and bicycles
- Grills (With tank removed)
- Plastic pieces (Including but not limited to plastic containers, tarps, large child's toys, pool toys, etc.)
- Household doors and shower doors
- Small amounts of carpet, padding, and rugs.
- Toilets

### NO! We CAN NOT pick these up:

- Any material resulting from work performed by a contractor
- Concrete, concrete blocks, posts with concrete attached and/or bricks
- **\*\*Propane and/or oxygen tanks**
- Sand, rocks, or dirt
- **\*\*TV's, monitors, computers, or other e-waste**
- **\*\*Paint, paint cans, oil, gasoline, refrigerants, or other hazardous chemicals**
- **\*\*Tires**
- NO HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE!
- Items in bags or boxes
- Donate-able items (Including books, bedding, clothing, bags, shoes, etc.)
- Packaging material
- Sheetrock, roofing, tile, plaster, and other building materials

**\*\* These items can be taken to the Hazardous Waste Facility to be disposed of properly. Contact them for more details at 704-920-3278.\*\***

Using recycling services provided by local agencies, nonprofits, and recycling companies across the state, a typical household can divert over 400 pounds per year of materials from landfills.

## **WATER RESTRICTIONS**

Please be advised that the Town of Harrisburg is under modified water use restrictions. Lawn irrigation will only be allowed on Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturdays. Violations of these restrictions may result in enforcement procedures, including warnings and fines.

These restrictions do not apply to those customers using well or ponds for irrigation purposes. However, all users are encouraged to remain diligent in their conservation efforts regardless of the water source.

Private wells used for irrigation purposes must be registered with the Town and display a visible well water irrigation sign. Signs are available free of charge at Harrisburg Town Hall.

The following activities are permitted at any time:

- The filling, operation or topping off of ornamental fountains.
- Residential car washing will be allowed using a hand held hose or pressure washer, both equipped with a spring loaded nozzle.
- Residential use of water for wash down of outside areas using a hand held hose or pressure washer, both equipped with a spring loaded nozzle.
- Watering of trees, flowers, shrubs, ornamental plants and vegetable gardens for plan preservation.
- Automated irrigation services may be installed and activated.
- Filling of swimming pools by permit. Topping off of previously filled pools is still acceptable at any time.
- All customers are allowed to use pressure washing devices.

**Both centers accept the following materials:**

**Commingled Paper** – newspaper, magazines, catalogs, phone books, junk mail, office paper, paperboard (like cereal boxes), paper bags, books. **NO TISSUE**

**Commingled Containers**– plastic bottles/jars #1-7, green, brown and clear glass, aluminum and steel cans **All items should be rinsed of food and other residues before being placed in the containers** **NO #6 STYROFOAM**

**Corrugated Cardboard** – please flatten; remove foam & plastic

**Please remove items from plastic bags; these can be recycled at local grocery stores.**

**Cabarrus County Landfill/ Recycling Convenience Center will also accept:**

- Used motor oil and filters
- Used cooking oil
- All grades of scrap metal (call about drums, tanks, power equipment etc.)
- Automotive/ marine Lead-Acid batteries
- Appliances (fridge, washer, stove, microwave, toaster, blender, water heater, etc.)
- Used tires (max 5 per load)
- Televisions/Electronics
- Wooden Pallets
- Oyster Shells

**HHW Facility/Recycling Convenience Center will also accept:**

- Used motor oil, oil bottles & oil filters
- Used cooking oil
- Used antifreeze
- All grades of scrap metal (call about drums, tanks, power equipment etc.)
- Batteries (of any type)
- Appliances (fridge, washer, stove, microwave, toaster, blender, water heater, etc.)
- Empty ink jet and toner cartridges
- Photographic Film and Disposable Cameras
- Televisions/Electronics
- Wooden Pallets

## WATER CONSERVATION

The Town of Harrisburg practices water conservation year round!

### WATER USE GUIDELINES

*The following activities will be allowed under the modified water use restrictions:*

- Lawn irrigation will **ONLY** be allowed on Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday.
- Those who violate the specified lawn irrigation days watering rule will receive written notice of the violation and the appropriate fee will be assessed.

### WATER IRRIGATION CONSERVATION TIPS:



- *Water during early morning hours or in the evening to reduce evaporation & avoid burning grass & plants.*
- *Use drought resistant plants when planting.*
- *Irrigate only when plants or your lawn need water.*
- *Do not apply more than one inch of water per week. A quick way to measure one inch is to have a tuna can near your sprinkler. A typical tuna can will hold one inch of water.*
- *A hand held hose with spring loaded nozzle should be used to limit water waste.*
- *Check all hoses, connectors, and irrigation heads for leaks.*
- *Make sure your sprinklers are not watering the street, driveway, or sidewalk.*
- *Do not operate sprinklers when it is raining.*

## **PREVENT SEWER BACKUPS; PROPERLY DISPOSE YOUR GREASE AND OIL.**

### **DID YOU KNOW...?**

- More than 15,000 sewer overflows occur each year in North Carolina; most are directly related to the improper disposal of grease and oil in kitchen drains.
- Most sanitary sewer backups occur between your home and the town's sewer main.
- Liquefied animal fats, grease and vegetable oils often congeal, clogging pipes and causing overflows.
- Sewer overflows threaten your home and the environment.

### **HOW TO HELP:**

- *Do not dispose of cooking grease or oils down drains or into toilets.*
- *Place cooking grease/oil in a sealed container (for example, an old coffee can or jar) and dispose in a trash receptacle.*
- *Wipe grease/oil residue from pots and pans with a paper towel and dispose in trash.*
- *Allow grease/oil to cool and solidify before disposing in trash.*

### **BUSINESSES AND THE TOWN ORDINANCE:**

The Town would like to remind local businesses with grease traps to ensure they are pumped regularly. Harrisburg's ordinance – specifically the "Fats, Oils and Greases Ordinance" – requires all traps to be pumped out at least quarterly. It also requires that users maintain a written record of trap maintenance for three (3) years. All applicable records must be available for inspection by the Town at all times.

Businesses may fax these records to 704-455-4761. The Town regularly inspects all grease traps and will be following up with record inspections in the coming months. A copy of the Town's ordinance is available online, [www.harrisburgnc.org](http://www.harrisburgnc.org), or by calling 704-455-4693.

**NORTH CAROLINA VOTER REGISTRATION APPLICATION**

Use of this form is for North Carolina residents only. You may use this form to:

- Register to vote in your county of residence;
- Pre-register to vote if you are 16 or 17 years old;
- Change your name and/or address in the county you are currently registered; or
- Declare a party affiliation or change party affiliation. (You must register with a party to vote in that party's primary unless that party allows unaffiliated voters to vote in its primary. In Section 6, if you indicated a political party that is not qualified or indicate no choice, you will be registered as "Unaffiliated.")

If you are not a resident of North Carolina, you can download the National Voter Registration Form at: [www.eac.gov](http://www.eac.gov).

**Requirements:**

- To be eligible to vote in the county you are registering in, you must have resided in that county for at least 30 days before the day of the election.
- If you are registering by mail, and cannot provide a valid ID number in Section 3, you must submit a copy of one of the following forms of current and valid identification with this application. If you do not provide this information, you will be required to provide one of these forms of ID to an election official when you vote for the first time in this county:
  - A current and valid photo identification
  - A current utility bill, or bank statement, government check or paycheck, or a government document that shows your name and address as it appears on this application.

**Qualifications:**

- You may register to vote only in the county in which you reside.
- You must be a US citizen by birth or naturalization.
- You must be at least 18 years of age by General Election Day, or at least 16 years of age to preregister and understand that you must be 18 years of age on or before election day to vote.
- If convicted of a felony, you may register to vote only after you have completed your sentence, including probation or parole. Once you have done that, North Carolina automatically restores your citizenship rights including your right to vote. No special document is needed.

**Special Notice:**

The location where you received this form will remain confidential and will be used only for registration administration purposes. If you decline to register to vote, the fact that you so declined will remain confidential.

**Registration Deadline:**


In order to be eligible to vote in an election, this form must be post-marked at least 25 days before the election, or hand delivered or faxed to the local board of elections office no later than 5:00 P.M. on the 25th day before the election. If faxed, the original must be received no later than 20 days before the election.

You may register to vote in person at a one-stop site in your home county during the one-stop voter registration and absentee voting period that occurs beginning the third Thursday before an election in which absentee ballots are authorized, and ending on the last Saturday before that election.

# Water Quality is Our Priority



## New Harrisburg Storm Water Program Begins August 2010

To assure the safety and quality of drinking water, the EPA now requires all municipalities to institute a program to improve the quality of storm water run-off.

Storm water consists of run off from roads, roofs, sidewalks and other impervious surfaces when it rains. It often carries pollutants like oil, grease, grass clippings and other debris into our drinking water supply.

The federal government does not provide money to fund such programs, so the Town of Harrisburg will implement a storm water fee for all residents and businesses within the Town limits.

What this means for you is that beginning in August, a new fee will be included in your water bill each month. The Town will charge each single family residence a flat fee of \$4.64 per month. Each non-residential customer will be assessed an equivalent residential unity (ERU) based on the amount of impervious (hard) surface on their property.

Here are some steps you can take to help increase the quality of storm water run-off entering our waterways:

- Don't dump waste into storm drains
- Dispose of household chemicals properly by following the directions on the package or contacting Public Works for proper disposal guidelines
- Clean up oil spills and fix leaking automobiles
- Sweep driveways clean instead of hosing them down
